### **Eric Kaufmann**

Eric Kaufmann is Reader in Politics at Birkbeck College, University of London. He was a Fellow at the Kennedy School, Harvard, in 2008-9. He is the author of *Shall the*

*Religious Inherit the Earth* (Profile Books, April 2010) and has written on religion and demography for *Newsweek International*, *Foreign Policy* and *Prospect* magazines, among others. In addition, he has written *The Rise and Fall of Anglo-America* (Harvard, 2004), *The Orange Order: A Contemporary Northern Irish History* (Oxford 2007; paperback 2009) and two other books on related themes. He is also an editor of the journal *Nations & Nationalism*.

He currently sits on the advisory council of the Centre for the Study of Democracy and is a senior advisor on power-sharing to the United Nations. In 2009, a book entitled *Consociational Theory: McGarry and O'Leary and the Northern Ireland Conflict* was published, edited by Rupert Taylor.

#### **Dan Miodownik**

Dan Miodownik (Ph.D., University of Pennsylvania, 2005) is an Assistant Professor in the Departments of Political science and International Relations at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem (Israel). His current research focuses on the emergence, unfolding and mitigation of violence in ethnic conflicts and civil wars. His work combines empirical and formal methodologies that rely on Agent Based Modeling, Large N statistics and Geographic Information Systems. His work has been published among others by the *American Political Science Review*, *Journal of Conflict Resolution*, *Comparative Politics*, *Studies in Comparative International Development*, and *Nationalism and Ethnic Politics*.
